

# Clair Timothy

Clair Timothy is a dynamic, high yielding, high quality, rust resistant, early Maturing variety that ages 1-2 weeks earlier than other varieties. It has high first and Second year forage production. Clair timothy preforms best with a pH between 5.5 to 7.0. It is tolerant to somewhat poorly drained soils, but will not tolerate wet soils, or soils prone to standing water. Nevertheless, it will not tolerate drought or prolonged high temperatures.

Clair Timothy is primarily used for hay and fits well in mixtures with an adapted legume such as alfalfa or red clover.

Clair Timothy hay unaccompanied or in mixtures with alfalfa, is much desired by horse owners. Due in part to that fact that over 70% of the total seasonal grass growth has been completed by the time the plant is at boot. In successive cuts of a Clair timothy-grass mixture, the legume will preponderate.

Clair endures, producing forage dry matter yields equivalent or superior to that of novel varieties. In recent variety trials, Clair, yielded more than six other timothy varieties included in the study. At another location, Clair yielded 21% and 24% more than "Timfor," and "Mohawk", over a three-year period. Timothy can be seeded in late/summer /early fall or late winter/early spring.
